

Catching up 2023 IRHA Workforce Development Scholarship Recipients

Joanna Davies - Effingham, IL Southern Illinois University Carbondale

I am currently the school social worker for grades 7-12 at the West Carroll CUSD 314. I work in the high school four days a week and the middle school one day per week. The high school is located in rural Savanna, IL, which is 31 miles south of Galena along the Mississippi River. The middle school is located in Mt. Carroll, IL, about 10 miles from the high school. Altogether there are just over 500 students total in both attendance centers.

Prior to my taking this position, the high school was served by an online school social worker as they were unable to fill the position in spite of having advertised for over two years. As the school social worker I provide in-person social and emotional support to students with Individualized Education Programs (IEPs). That means I meet with students



one-on-one in my office where we work towards goals that address issues such as socialization, executive functioning skills, work refusal, and more. I also meet with general education students who are in crisis or just need someone to talk to. Working with parents and school staff is also part of my job to ensure these kids achieve success in school and life.


Thank you again for the scholarship. It helped me achieve my goal of graduating and ultimately serving rural Illinois school kids and their families.



Resources Available for Rural Providers through IL HIV Care Connect

Access to comprehensive medical care is a pervasive issue that affects those living in rural America, but especially those who are living with HIV, or newly diagnosed with HIV. With more than 10% or more of new HIV diagnosis occurring in rural areas, it is imperative that rural providers know of the resources available to them as well as their patients.

Funded by the Illinois Department of Public Health, Illinois HIV Care Connect is a statewide network providing medical case management, health care and support services to persons living with HIV. The state is divided into 8 regions with a lead agency office for each one.

Providers can refer patients to one of the eight lead agency offices where the patient can confidentially enroll for services and be assigned a case manager, who will determine their eligibility for services and benefits, which could include ambulatory care, mental health services, legal service, rental assistance, etc.

Primary care providers can also benefit from free training

programs (many are webinars) to help build HIV treatment skills and learn how to access free clinical consultation services when managing the treatment needs of HIV patients through the Midwest AIDS Training and Education Center. For more information on trainings and how to enroll in the network, please visit

Illinois HIV Care Connect recently launched its Health Beyond HIV Campaign., which through their website and social media can help persons living with HIV avoid or manage co-morbidities, since they are at higher risk for conditions such as cardiovascular disease, cancer, diabetes, etc. A Health Beyond HIV Quia offers an easy way to understand how to reduce risks associated with HIV. Health Beyond HIV Quiz

However, persons living with HIV can reduce risks associated with these co-morbidities by receiving antiretroviral therapy, or ART, exactly as prescribed to suppress HIV to undetectable levels in the blood. Other ways to reduce these risks include receiving recommended health screenings, preventive care and vaccinations and by following healthy diet and exercise regimens. Lowering these risks increases a person's chances of living a long and healthy life.



Getting and staying in regular health care can be a challenge for anyone, but it's especially important for persons living with HIV. Care providers that understand HIV can help their patients to stay on track with recommended screenings and vaccinations and provide regular encouragement to keep up with a healthy diet and exercise.

American Dental Education Association, American Association of Orthodontics, Association of Dental Support Organization, and American Student Dental Association. This collaborative effort advocates for licensure transportability, mirroring the familiar concept of a driver's license. The impediment to providing care across state lines due to bureaucratic barriers is addressed through this endeavor. States can become members of the compact by enacting the compact model legislation through the state's legislature and governor. So far, Iowa, Tennessee and Washington State have enacted licensure compact legislation.

As an update regarding the Public Health Dental Hygienist (PHDH) grant. We are on the cusp of achieving our objective to train and reimburse appropriately seventy-five hygienists trained during the grant distribution period. Data of the 2023 patient impact of this relatively new model will be accessible in early 2024. The encounter numbers for the last 3 years are



included below. In 2022, over 8000 individuals benefitting from the intervention of a Public Health Dental Hygienist. Please see information table compiled by the Illinois Department of Public Health.

PHDHs provide new patients with preventive care prior to the dental exam; including oral assessment records such as radiographs, periodontal measurements, teeth cleaning, sealants, and topical fluoride. The utilization of teledentistry proves beneficial in instances health departments lacking a full-time dentist. In situations where the DDS is not physically present to conduct an exam, patient's intra-oral images may be transmitted, for an asynchronously or synchronously examination. This approach can prove invaluable in urgent scenarios, ensuring that patients receive the necessary care regardless of geography or time constraints.

Embracing Change to Achieve Successful Outcomes with PCMH

Before I became the director of quality improvement at The Compliance Team, I worked for a Critical Access Hospital that had a dozen Rural Health Clinics (RHC). I was tasked with overseeing a department that hadn't been developed yet. We were calling it our integrated care department, and it would be responsible for patient activities that would lead to improved outcomes through care coordination and community resources. The main programs I would oversee would be chronic care management (CCM) and an initiative developed by Missouri Medicaid called the Primary Care Health Home (PCHH).

One of the requirements for PCHH participation was Patient-Centered Medical Home (PCMH) accreditation. Once we were accepted into the PCHH program, we could begin enrolling patients who were Medicaid beneficiaries and had chronic medical and/or behavioral health diagnoses. We would manage their care utilizing RNs, behavioral health consultants, and community health workers,

surrounding them with a care team in close collaboration with their primary care provider. For each patient enrolled in this program, we were paid a set amount per member per month. Being able to fund these services for our patients was going to be a game changer.

I knew very little about PCMH and was thrilled to learn that The Compliance Team offered an accreditation program that would sit nicely atop our RHC accreditation with them.

PCMH is a model designed to deliver value-based care and allow providers to facilitate wellness at a lower cost, which will make the organization more successful when participating in new and future programs. PCMH principles are based on enhancing day-to-day operations to improve patient access and strengthen care coordination activities to bridge gaps in health care delivery.

Change is challenging, but the transformation I witnessed within the clinics and our patients' lives was undeniable. The focus shifted from illness to wellness. We were having discussions about prevention at each visit, assessing for barriers, such as social determinants of health, and offering resources. We made efforts to identify patients frequently accessing the ER and work with them to establish action plans. Staff were feeling more invested, and patients were becoming more engaged. It was a true culture shift.

Value-based care, also known as accountable care, is ultimately designed to improve patient satisfaction and outcomes while financially rewarding providers for the quality of care they are providing at a lower cost.

Within just a couple of years of becoming a PCMH, our chronic care management program had grown from 100 to approximately 1,500 patients and our efforts were being rewarded within our ACO. Other payers were inviting us to participate in financially rewarding incentive programs. Our volume had increased due to a focus on capturing annual wellness visits, and our star ratings significantly improved. We never looked back.

The Promoting Adolescent Health (PATHway) Research Team Seeks Your Help to Increase Awareness of Study for Teens and their Families

The Promoting AdolescenT Health (PATHWay) research team is partnering with the National Center for Rural Health Professions to let community -based health care providers know about the opportunity for teens at risk for depression and their families to participate in this prevention study.
